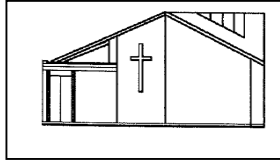

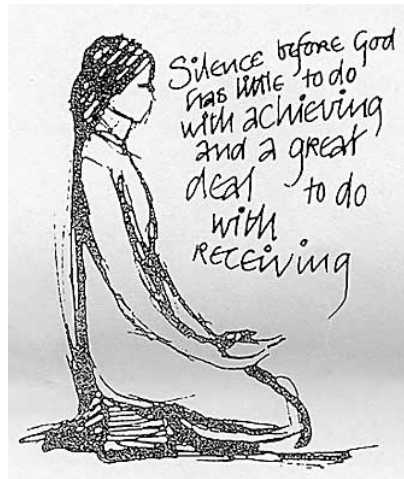

INTRODUCTION TO THE SCRIPTURE READINGS

First reading Genesis 22:1-2, 9-13, 15-18

This story of the sacrifice of Isaac emphasizes that true sacrifice lies in faith and obedience rather than in actual slaughter.

Second reading Romans 8:31-34

At the heart of faith is the confidence that, if God wills to save us, he does not will to accuse and condemn us.

Gospel Mark 9:2-10

When the baptism of Jesus marks the beginning of His ministry, the transfiguration marks the beginning of the disciples' awareness of the true nature of His mission.
